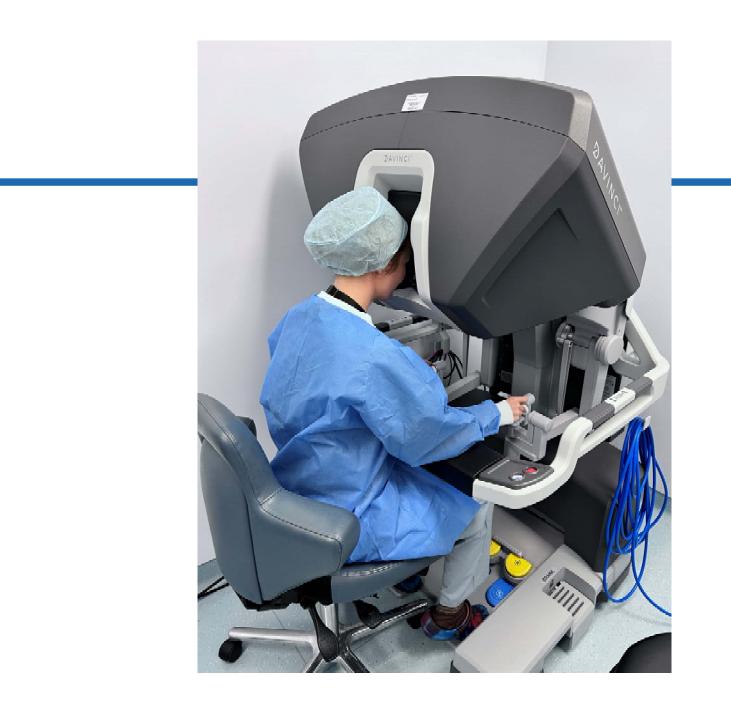

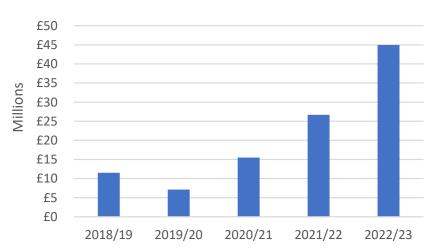






Annual Capital Investment – 2022/23

- £44.9m of capital investment across 2022/23, including capital infrastructure, clinical equipment and digital equipment.
- 69% increase on 21/22 capital expenditure and a 400% increase in capital expenditure, compared to 2018/19.
- 2022/23 includes £35.9m of Public Dividend Capital funding from Department of Health and Social Care for specific capital infrastructure projects, following successful bids.
- Alignment to 2021-26 Trust Strategy to 'Improve our Infrastructure and how we use it' and Archus External Review of Trusts Estates and Improvement Plan developed in mid 2021









Modular Theatres Phase 1 – Clatterbridge Hospital

- Targeted Investment Funded (TIF) project for the establishment of the South Mersey Surgical Hub, providing additional elective surgery for Wirral, Merseyside and Cheshire patients.
- Multi-year programme which included the installation of modular operating theatres and refurbishment of the theatre complex at Clatterbridge Hospital. Includes:
 - Two modular theatres to HBN standards
 - 12 Recovery bays
 - New ventilation systems
 - New staff change and rest areas
- Completion in October 2022 and was the first operating theatre complex completed as part of national TIF funding
- Cost: £10.6m









- Relocation and construction of new Renal Unit at Arrowe Park Hospital (Ground Floor)
- Includes:
 - 6 Renal Chairs
 - 14 Renal Beds
 - 2 Isolation Rooms/ Procedure Areas
 - Dedicated Dialysis Engineering Unit
 - Staff spaces
 - New ventilation systems meeting HTMs
- £2.8m cost of new unit
- Completed in December 2022







Urgent and Emergency Care Upgrade Programme (UECUP)

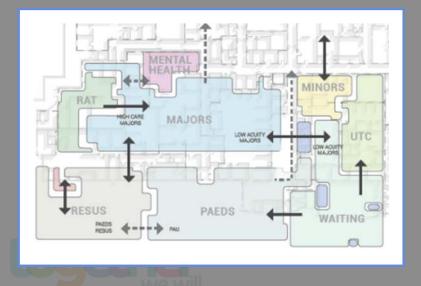
- Full Business Case for UECUP approved in August 2022.
- Multi-year redevelopment of Accident & Emergency Department and Urgent Treatment Centre at Arrowe Park Hospital
- £35m redevelopment, with £18m of support from Department of Health and Social Care
- New clinical model for urgent and emergency care and redevelopment of 4,000sqm of buildings
- Enabling works commenced in October 2022 and main works commenced in December 2022, with completion in 2025



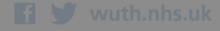




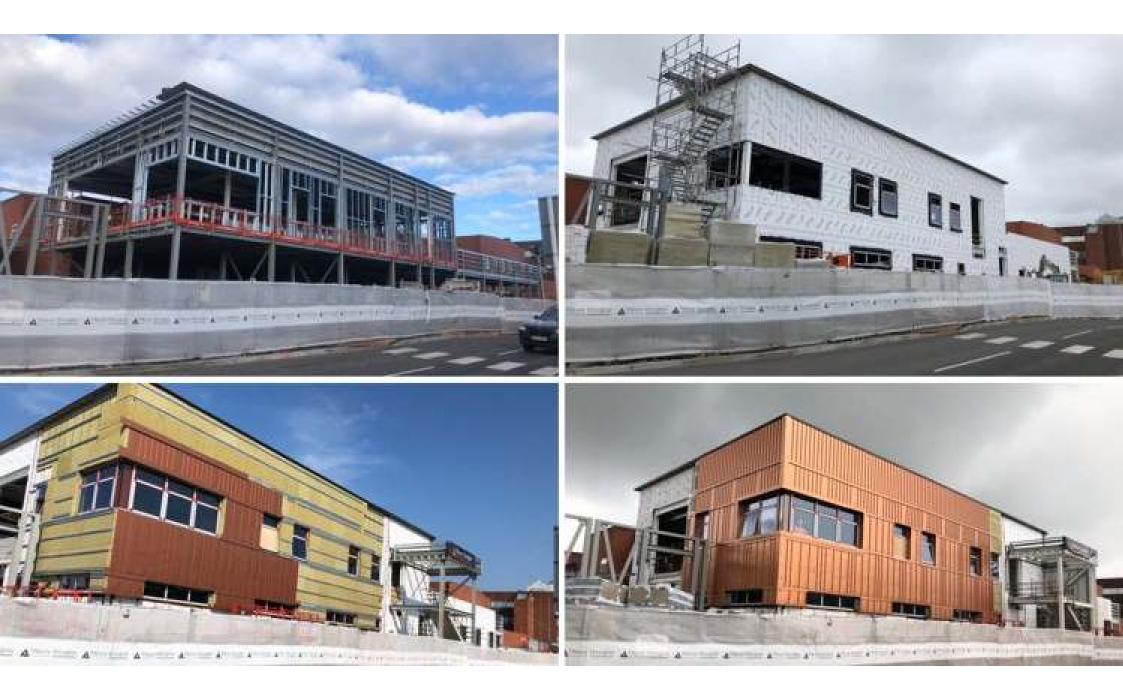














Low Carbon Steel Pipework replacement

- Replacement of heating and cooling pipework across the Arrowe Park Hospital campus, wards and basement areas
- Three year programme, with a 2022/23 value of £2.9m
- 2022/23 focused on basement and Level 1 wards replacement and upgrades, with 2023/24 focusing on Basement and Women's and Children's Hospital building.

Modular Theatres and Refurbishments (Phase 2) – Clatterbridge Hospital

- TIF funded programme which included the installation of 2 x additional modular operating theatres and further refurbishment of the theatre complex at Clatterbridge Hospital. Includes:
 - 2 x Theatres
 - 6 x Recovery bays
 - Anaesthetic Rooms
 - Procedure/Endoscopy Suite
 - Additional consultation rooms
 - · Lay up Rooms
 - Stores
 - Offices
- Project Completed October 2023
- Cost: £14.9m

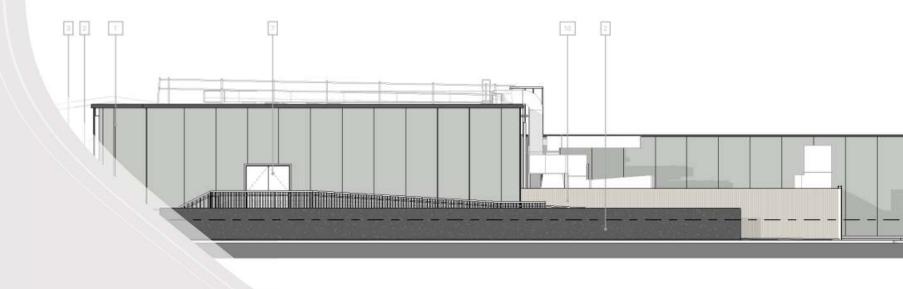
Community Diagnostic Centre (CDC) - Clatterbridge Hospital

- TIF funded programme which includes:
 - MRI and CT facilities
 - Consultation rooms
 - Staff facilities
 - Link bridge to theatres
- £10m scheme, due for completion in March 2024
- Modular building delivered in August 2023

Financial Headlines: 2022/23 in numbers

- £24.3m cash balances at the end of the year.
- Capital Investment of £43.8m in our Estate, Infrastructure and Critical Equipment.
- Original plan was revised, with ICB agreement, to an operating deficit of £6.8m.
- Actual operating position was the agreed deficit of £6.8m (this is before a reduction in value of land and buildings of £3.5m).

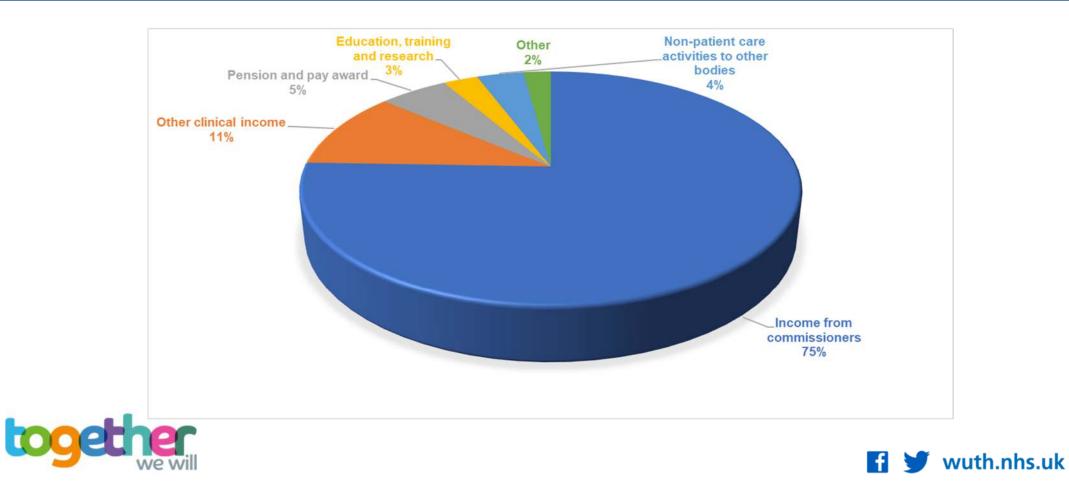






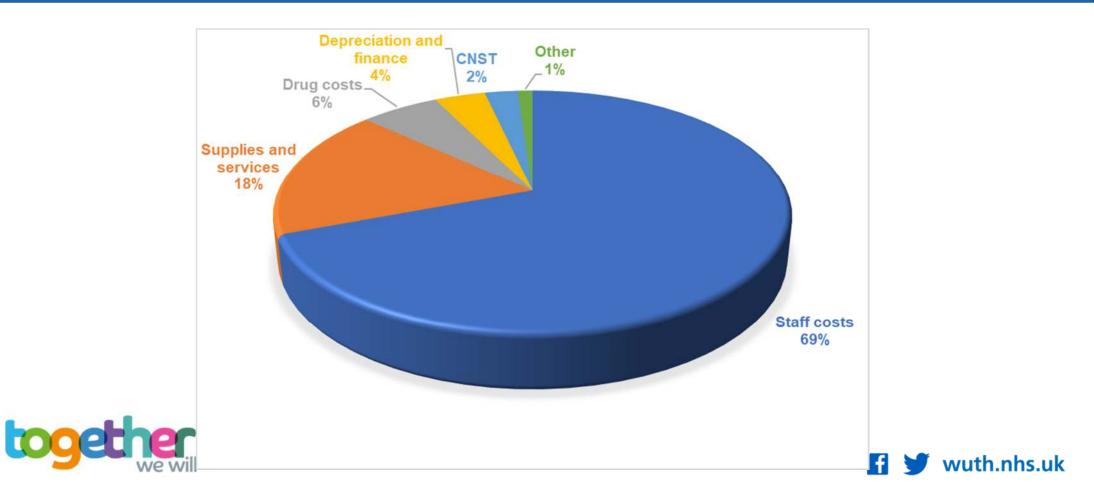


Total Income - £490m

Capital Expenditure: £43.8m

The Trust made the following investments during the year:

- **£28.7m** New build:
 - Clatterbridge theatres
 - Phase 1 Clinical Diagnostic Centre
 - UECUP
- **£7.1m** Improvements to the Trust's built estate including:
 - Ward refurbishment
 - Heating and chilled waterpipe upgrade
 - Fire compartmentation
 - Theatre ventilation
- **£4.9m** Medical equipment
- **£3.1m** Information technology improvement schemes.







Forward look...

Finance Regime 2023/24

- One principal contract with ICB for elective and non-elective activity.
- Removal of dedicated funding for COVID-19.
- Cost improvement target of 5% of operating costs (£26.2m).
- Planned deficit of £18.9m.

Capital Programme 2023/24

- **£26.8m** programme to enhance patient environment and replace critical equipment. Including:
 - £15.8m UECUP
 - £4.1m CDC phase 2
 - £4.3m Estates infrastructure improvement
 - £1.8m Medical equipment
 - £0.8m Investment in Information Technology

National context

- Cost pressures increasing
- Political pressures increasing
- Complexity of financial reporting increasing
- Transparency within integrated care systems
- Loss of financial expertise nationally
- 70% of NHS accounts met deadline in 2022/23
- Whole of government accounts 2020/21 signed July 2023 qualified audit opinion
